Construction crews continue to install sheathing on the south end and set forms and pour concrete on the north end of the building. On Feb. 3, workers poured concrete for the roof on the north side, which was the last big pour of the project. They are now constructing the middle section of the building and will proceed with smaller concrete pours for each of the three floors throughout February and March. We still anticipate the framing to be completed and the final structural beam to be placed by mid-March. Be on the lookout for additional information as we celebrate this milestone in the construction process. Although we reached the \$50 million fundraising goal in record time, fundraising efforts continue.
