NEW FRONTIERS UPDATE March 2024

This week is quieter than most on campus as our students are enjoying spring break. However, there continues to be tremendous activity on the New Frontiers construction site as we are nearing the completion of the building. Work continues simultaneously outside and inside the building in preparation for three important dates.

- 1. May 20 The first of 13 semi-truck furniture shipments will begin on this date.
- 2. **June 3** This is the "substantial" completion date, which means the building is complete, and we will start moving into the building.
- 3. **July 29** "Final" completion is scheduled for this date, and we can start occupying the building with people.

In addition, March came in like a lion with devastating wildfires affecting western Oklahoma. During the wildfires, our team went to work disseminating content resources about farm stress and disaster recovery, feeding livestock suddenly without forage, caring for injured and orphaned livestock, carcass disposal and more. Local Extension educators in the affected areas are helping to organize donation efforts for feed, hay, milk/colostrum replacer and fencing supplies. In the days and weeks ahead, they will guide and help lead the recovery efforts including organizing and publicizing meetings for disaster-related programs from FSA, continued care for wounded animals, documenting loss, pasture regrowth, cattle nutrition, OSU Extension resources on farm stress/mental health and more. OSU Extension's Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART) – an agile group comprised of fellow county educators, state and area Extension specialists, administrators and support staff – is assisting these county educators.

I recently had the chance to visit parts of our state and witness the generosity of farming and ranching communities donating feed, fence and other needed resources. I encourage you to watch this segment on SUNUP to learn more about the devastating effects of wildfire and how Oklahomans are lending a helping hand.

In short, the meaningful work of our faculty and Extension educators is making a difference in support of our land-grant mission. Whether you are enjoying a vacation, participating in livestock shows or sports, or carrying on with your regular activities, I wish you a good spring break.
