NEW FRONTIERS UPDATE May 2023

With the New Frontiers Agricultural Hall construction well underway and its opening scheduled in a little more than a year, our future is as bright as ever. The building will help attract top-quality students and faculty and will foster collaboration and innovation in teaching, research and Extension to advance our land-grant mission. while progress continues on the placement of the multitude of windows. Workers are moving counterclockwise around the building, mainly working on the east side, and are about 50% complete with windows. Once the building is dried in with the finished roof and windows, the installation of drywall will begin in late summer.

In early May, we hosted a group of donors for a hard hat tour, including the Ingersoll family, who are cornerstone donors, as well as members of P&K Equipment and those connected to John Deere. We were fortunate to have Kay Ingersoll's grandson, a future Ferguson College of Agriculture student, join us and tour alongside a cornerstone donor. Participants got to see the locations of their named spaces firsthand and view the building's progress. The last stop on the tour was a group photo on the roof. The building will include departmental suites created to reduce redundancy and increase the efficiency of operations. A total of six academic departments and three programs and institutes are in the shared suites.






